The Operations Reports provide details on the coastal ferry services delivered by BC Ferries during the reporting period, including the overall number of sailings provided by BC Ferries and its performance against CFSC minimums. (Please see the glossary at Section 6B for a further explanation of terms used in this document.)

It is important to note that some FY2024 numbers presented in this report may differ than those reported during the previous fiscal year. With amendments to the CFSC for PT6 (commencing FY2025,) round trips provided by alternative service (water taxi, tug & barge, etc.) are no longer included for the purpose of meeting core service levels. For comparative purposes, the FY2024 numbers in this report have been presented based on these new parameters. For example, the counts for round trips, AEQ and passenger in the operations summary in the previous FY2024 reports would have included alternative service. However those same counts presented in this report's operations summary (Section 1A) do not include alternative service. Similarly, capacity utilization and overload numbers presented in the FY2024 reports include alternative service but this report's numbers do not (Sections 1A, 4A and 4C.) Unless otherwise noted, any variances are immaterial.

In Q2 Fiscal 2025, BC Ferries delivered more than 24,500 sailing round trips and carried almost 131,000 more vehicle equivalents and almost 176,000 more passengers than the same period last year. This was accomplished while sailing over 200 more roundtrips than this quarter last year, improving overall on time performance (+0.6%) and reducing the number of cancelled sailings by almost a quarter (22.0%).

Despite that progress, mechanical issues on the major routes accounted for a significant amount (49.9%) of all sailing cancellations in Q2. The majority of these can be attributed to the propeller issues facing the 60-year-old Queen of New Westminster, which has taken it out of service for approximately six months. In a time of rising passenger and vehicle demand, the significant impact of these cancellations and the lack of resiliency on the major routes has meant an increasing number of sailings overloaded (335 more major route sailings, or +1.2%). This evidence speaks to the critical need for the five new major vessels BC Ferries is seeking to build, including the 5th vessel in particular that will add resiliency and capacity to the fleet to be better responsive to the expectations and public interest of customers.

More positively, there were no cancellations on the major routes due to crew-related issues in this quarter. In fact, across the coastal ferry system, crewing accounted for only 7.8% (31) of all cancelled sailings. This is evidence of continued progress in BC Ferries' efforts to attract and retain mariners, and stabilize the workforce to give customers greater certainty about when they will sail.

This quarter, BC Ferries once again surpassed the contract minimums on almost all of the routes, including 835.5 round trips on the major routes, and continued to deliver an essential public service for customers and the communities we serve.


